Jim Metzner has been producing sound-rich radio programs for the past 30 years, beginning his career with a piece for NPR's Voices in the Wind - the predecessor to All Things Considered, followed by his groundbreaking short format series - You're Hearing Boston, produced for CBS station WEEI-FM. Metzner's other award-winning series include You're Hearing San Francisco, You're Hearing America, The Sounds of Science, and **Pulse of the Planet**, now it in its twentieth year and 4000th broadcast.

Jim has received major grants from the National Science Foundation, NASA and the National Endowment for the Humanities. In 2006, he was awarded a fellowship at the Marine Biological Laboratory in Woods Hole. His work has been featured in Wired Magazine, the New York Times, Audio Magazine, National Geographic, the Wall Street Journal and on the CBS Evening News.

Metzner has recorded all over the world and produced features for public radio's Marketplace, All Things Considered and Morning Edition. His most recent project is an NSF funded nationwide competition for third to sixth graders, the **Kids' Science Challenge**.
